No Accommodation

Our Classic Day Programme is ideal for young learners who have already made accommodation arrangements, but wish to combine their time in Brighton with the opportunity to take fun and high quality English lessons combined with an action packed activity programme with their classmates.

Description

The Classic Day Programme provides an ideal supplement to a family holiday for teenage children. Teenagers can learn English, socialise with other students from around the world, and take part in an action packed activity programme. In the morning students should make their own way to the EC Centre to attend lessons or activities. After lunch students will be taken directly to afternoon activities/lessons. Following the afternoon activity or lesson, students will return to join their family. Classic Day Programme students are included in evening and weekend activities, unless parental permission to miss such activities is provided.

Important

- It is important that when bookings are made, EC is provided with the address of the student's accommodation. This way a student Welcome Pack including information about the school/classes and activity times can be delivered to the student.
- EC must be advised upon booking of any medical conditions, allergies or medication that needs to be administered to students.
- European students travelling with a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) are entitled to free public healthcare. All other students are required to pay approximately £50 to see a doctor, which students must pay at the time of their visit.





Learning: Learning Centre

Classes are held at Mithras House, located 30 minutes away by bus from the city centre. Mithras House is on a campus belonging to the University of Brighton and provides excellent facilities. Classes are taken in a variety of tutorial rooms and purpose built lecture theatres, all of which are finished to a high standard. There are many areas where students can relax in their break time including the restaurant with vending facilities.

Course

At EC Brighton students have a choice of attending either a General English course or an Intensive English course.

- **General English - 20 lessons (45 mins each) per week.** The course will help improve English language skills by focusing on the key areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A strong focus is placed on speech and using the language confidently and fluently. Lesson times are either 08:30 – 11:45 with a 15 minute break or 14:15 - 17:30 with a 15 minute break.
- **Intensive English - 30 lessons (45 mins each) per week.** This course follows a similar programme to General English but with 2 extra lessons every afternoon. Lesson times are 08:30 - 14:00 (or 12:30 - 17:30 on alternate weeks) with two 15 minute breaks. Please note, students will be able to follow the activity programme if they participate in the Intensive Programme, however some half-day excursions might be different from the other students on the General English Course.
- On the first day, all **students sit a placement test** - The placement test assesses students in listening, reading, writing and use of English allowing academic staff to place students in the relevant group for their ability.
- Students study in classes of a **maximum of 15 students**
- Our dedicated and **professional teaching staff** provide feedback and support and help students build confidence to speak English.
- **International classes**
- EC Brighton may utilise a Double Banking timetable. Put simply, students attend morning classes one week and afternoon classes the following.

Attendance

All students must attend school on a daily basis unless they are genuinely indisposed (due to illness, for example).

- Course book and educational materials are provided
- Students should bring their own notepaper and pens





After School: Meals

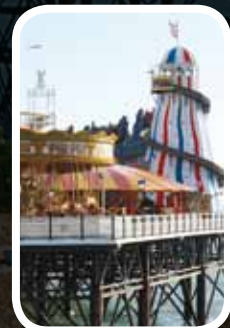
During the week students will receive lunch at Mithras House or in town. On Saturday excursions students are to bring their own packed lunch.

Activities

A full and varied activity programme is included in the package.

This will include a trip to the Royal Pavilion, as well as visits to other major points of interest so students can experience the architecture and cosmopolitan atmosphere of this great city. Other fantastic visits include a Brighton Tour, where students can familiarise themselves with Brighton and all the attractions in the city. Students will also visit the amazing Sea Life Centre in Brighton combining the splendour of rich Victorian architecture with over 30 modern marine and freshwater habitats, and featuring one of the longest underwater tunnels in England. A day trip to London to experience the sights and attractions which attract millions of visitors every year is included too.

Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

Customer Complaints

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an Initial Course Evaluation form, in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction should they feel unable to speak to us directly. Solutions to any issues will be provided and all necessary parties will be notified when applicable. Students are also requested to complete an End of Course Evaluation form at the end of their stay such that they have the opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organised activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate

Alcohol Consumption and Smoking Policy

As per U.K. law any EC student on the Junior Programme caught consuming alcohol during their stay risks being expelled from the school and repatriated to their home country. No alcohol is permitted in the school or residence regardless of age. Smoking is not permitted during any part of the programme

Drugs

PLEASE NOTE: The consumption of any illegal drugs will result in the immediate expulsion and repatriation of the student and the possible intervention of the police.

Expulsion

EC reserves the right to expel and repatriate a student at his/her own expense for any of the following reasons:

- Possession of any illegal drugs
- Drinking or bringing alcohol on to any EC premises
- Malicious damage to school property or place of accommodation
- If the student is a danger to his/her own safety or that of other students
- Breaking English law
- Repeated failure to attend academic lessons and/or social activities

In any of the above circumstances the student is informed that their stay is going to be terminated with immediate effect. Simultaneously EC informs the student's agent of the student's behaviour and the course of action to be taken. The earliest flight available is booked at the student's expense and an EC staff member accompanies the student to the airport to ensure that the student leaves the country. Following such action EC will terminate all relationships with the student and will be unable to take further responsibility for the student. No refunds will be given to any students who have been expelled.
