EC Classic Day Brighton

Ages: 13 - 17 years

What's included: lessons, course materials, supervised activity programme & a variety of hot and cold lunches

The Junior Day Programme provides an ideal supplement to a family holiday for teenage children. Teenagers can learn English, socialise with other students from around the world, and take part in an action packed activity programme.

The Programme:

In the morning students should make their own way to the EC Centre to attend lessons or activities. After lunch students will be taken directly to afternoon activities/lessons. Following the afternoon activity or lesson, students will return to join their family. Junior Day programme students are included in evening and weekend activities, unless parental permission to miss such activities is provided.

Course

Students study with other EC students at one of our junior centres. On the first day of school students will sit a placement test in order to assess their level. Students will then join a class with students who have the same level of English. Classes are held at the following EC Junior Centres

- 22/06/09 till 03/07/09 – Mithras House
- 06/07/09 till 14/08/09 - St Mary's Hall
- 17/08/09 till 28/08/09) – MithrasHouse

Important

It is important that when bookings are made, EC is provided with the address of the student's accommodation. This way a student Welcome Pack including information about the school/classes and activity times can be delivered to the student.

At EC Brighton students have a choice of attending either a General English course or an Intensive English course. Students study in international classes with a maximum of 15 students per class.

General English

The course will help improve English language skills by focusing on both skills (reading, writing, speaking and listening) and systems (grammar and pronunciation). Students are taught in a fun and interesting way intended to build confidence when using English in everyday situations.

- Students study in classes of their language ability.
- Students receive 20 lessons per week (15 hrs)

Intensive English

Intensive English follows a similar programme to General English but with 2 extra lessons every afternoon. This gives more exposure to the English language helping students to progress at a faster pace.

- Students receive 30 lessons per week (22.5 hours)

Note: EC Brighton may utilise a Double Banking timetable. Put simply, students attend morning sessions of classes one week, the next week they attend afternoon sessions.

Activities

A full and varied activity programme is included in the package. This will include a trip to the Royal Pavilion, as well as visits to other major points of interest so students can experience the architecture and cosmopolitan atmosphere of this great city.

Other fantastic visits include a Brighton Tour, where students can familiarise themselves with Brighton and all the attractions in the city. Students will also visit the amazing Sea Life Centre in Brighton combining the splendour of rich Victorian architecture with over 30 modern marine and freshwater habitats, and featuring one of the longest underwater tunnels in England. A day trip to London to experience the sights and attractions which attract millions of visitors every year is included too.

What's Included?

- English Course 20/30 lessons (45 minutes each) per week
- Maximum 15 students per class
- Course book

Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

Customer Complaints

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is dissatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff. During the first week of school, all students are given an 'Initial Course Evaluation Form', in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction, should they feel unable to speak to us directly. An EC staff member will talk to any student who rates a service as 'poor' or 'not so good' in their Initial Course Evaluation Form. They will try to find a solution as quickly as possible. If the problem cannot be resolved immediately, an official complaint form is filled in and the student's agent will also be informed. A thorough investigation will be carried out. The Initial Course Evaluation Form is given to the students during their first few days at EC so that problems can be solved immediately and not disrupt the remainder of their time with us. There is also an End-of-Course Evaluation Form which gives the students an opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organised activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate

Alcohol Consumption

No alcohol is permitted in the school or residence regardless of age.

Drugs

PLEASE NOTE: The consumption of any illegal drugs is strictly forbidden.

Expulsion

EC will not tolerate any of the following:

- Possession of any illegal drugs
- Drinking or bringing alcohol on to any EC premises
- Malicious damage to school property or place of accommodation
- If the student is a danger to his/her own safety or that of other students
- Breaking English law
- Repeated failure to attend academic lessons and/or social activities

In any of the above circumstances EC will inform the student's agent and/or the parents that the stay is going to be terminated with immediate effect. Simultaneously EC informs the student's agent and/or parent of the student's behaviour and the course of action to be taken. Following such action EC will terminate all relationships with the student and will be unable to take further responsibility for the student. No refunds will be given to any students who have been expelled.
