## Classic Day Programme:

**Available:** 22 June - 21 August

**Minimum course duration:** 1 week

**What's included:** lessons, course materials, supervised activity programme & a variety of hot and cold lunches

### No Accommodation

The Junior Day Programme provides an ideal supplement to a family holiday for teenage children. Teenagers can learn English, socialise with other students from around the world, and take part in the action packed activity programme.

### Description

The Classic Day Programme provides an ideal supplement to a family holiday for teenage children. Teenagers can learn English, socialise with other students from around the world, and take part in an action packed activity programme. In the morning students should make their own way to the EC Centre to attend lessons or activities. After lunch students will be taken directly to afternoon activities/lessons. Following the afternoon activity or lesson, students will return to join their family. Junior Day programme students are included in evening and weekend activities, unless parental permission to miss such activities is provided.

### Important

It is important that when bookings are made, EC is provided with the address and telephone number of the student's accommodation. This way a letter is sent to students explaining first day details etc.





## Learning: Learning Centre

Classes are at Chesterton Community College which is located near the heart of Cambridge City, first established in 1935 as two separate schools for boys and girls and now a co-educational college for 11 – 16s. It has extensive recreational and sports facilities, and in fact plays host to a community Sports Centre which boasts a swimming pool, gymnasium, tennis courts and grass pitches.

### Course

At EC Cambridge students have a choice of attending either a General English course or an Intensive English course.

- General English - 20 lessons (45 mins each) per week. The course will help improve English language skills by focusing on the key areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A strong focus is placed on speech and using the language confidently and fluently.
- Intensive English - 30 lessons (45 mins each) per week. This course follows a similar programme to General English but with 2 extra lessons between 12.30 - 14.00.
- On the first day, all students sit a placement test - The placement test assesses students in listening, reading, writing and use of English allowing academic staff to place students in the relevant group for their ability.
- Students study in classes of a maximum of 15 students
- Our dedicated and professional teaching staff provide feedback and support and help students build confidence to speak English.
- International classes
- EC Cambridge may utilise a Double Banking timetable. Put simply, students attend morning sessions of classes one week, the next week they attend afternoon sessions.

### Attendance

All students must attend school on a daily basis unless they are genuinely indisposed (due to illness, for example). In the case of a student falling ill we ask homestay provider to take the student to their family doctor. If the student is ill during school hours a member of staff will, if required, accompany them to the hospital (Out-Patients). European students travelling with an European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) are entitled to free public healthcare. All other students are required to pay approximately £60 to see a doctor, which students must pay at the time of their visit.

### Note

- Course book and educational materials are provided
- Students should bring their own notepaper and pens





## After School: Meals

Students will have breakfast at their accommodation. Lunch is provided in various outlets in Cambridge, these may include restaurants such as Nando's, Chilis, and Bella Italia, offering a variety of cuisines. Social Leaders will accompany students to pre-arranged restaurants each day. Packed lunches will be provided on full day excursions. Dinner is also provided.

If students require a vegetarian diet we must be informed of this prior to their arrival.

## Activities

A full and varied activity programme is included in the package.

This will include a trip to a University of Cambridge college, as well as visits to other major points of interest so students can experience the architecture and history of this great city. Other fantastic tours include the Fitzwilliam Museum, the art museum of the University of Cambridge. It was founded in 1816 and contains magnificent collections of works of art and antiquities. A day trip to London to experience the sights and attractions which attract millions of visitors every year is also included.

## Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

### Customer Complaints

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an Initial Course Evaluation form, in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction should they feel unable to speak to us directly. Solutions to any issues will be provided and all necessary parties will be notified when applicable. Students are also requested to complete an End of Course Evaluation form at the end of their stay such that they have the opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

### Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organised activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate

### Alcohol Consumption and Smoking Policy

As per U.K. law any EC student on the Junior Programme caught consuming alcohol during their stay risks being expelled from the school and repatriated to their home country. No alcohol is permitted in the school or residence regardless of age. Smoking is not permitted during any part of the programme

### Drugs

PLEASE NOTE: The consumption of any illegal drugs will result in the immediate expulsion and repatriation of the student and the possible intervention of the police.

### Expulsion

EC reserves the right to expel and repatriate a student at his/her own expense for any of the following reasons:

- Possession of any illegal drugs
- Drinking or bringing alcohol on to any EC premises
- Malicious damage to school property or place of accommodation
- If the student is a danger to his/her own safety or that of other students
- Breaking English law
- Repeated failure to attend academic lessons and/or social activities

In any of the above circumstances the student is informed that their stay is going to be terminated with immediate effect. Simultaneously EC informs the student's agent of the student's behaviour and the course of action to be taken. The earliest flight available is booked at the student's expense and an EC staff member accompanies the student to the airport to ensure that the student leaves the country. Following such action EC will terminate all relationships with the student and will be unable to take further responsibility for the student. No refunds will be given to any students who have been expelled.
