Jesus College Residence

The prestigious Jesus Residence is situated in the centre of the beautiful city of Cambridge, a 20 - 25 minutes' walk from Chesterton Community College, EC's Junior Center. Shops, cafés, sports facilities, a multiplex cinema and the historical sites of Cambridge are all within walking distance of Jesus Residence. Students stay in comfortable single or twin rooms in individual houses. Between 6 and 12 students normally stay in each house and are fully supervised by a live-in EC Social Leader. There are between 2 and 4 bathrooms per house and a communal area where students can sit and relax.

What students should expect from their residence:

- Single or Twin room - students in a twin room are placed with other students of the same sex
- Shared bathroom (1 bathroom per 4 or 5 students)
- Full board accommodation
- Bed linen is provided and changed weekly; students should bring their own towels
- Students can use the washing machines in each house, they will be responsible for their own laundry. If they would like to use the washing machines more than once a week students must provide their own laundry washing powder.
- Student rooms contain a wardrobe, writing desk, chair, reading lamp, mirror, notice board, single beds and chest of drawers. The rooms may contain a hand wash basin.
- The communal area includes a kitchen where the live-in social leader and students will prepare breakfast and a dining area.
- Bedrooms are cleaned and tidied weekly, communal areas are cleaned and tidied daily. However, all students should assist in keeping both their own rooms and communal areas tidy.
- Students are taken to school by their Social Leader, it is just a 20 to 25 minute walk to the junior centre. Should students opt to catch a bus to school, bus passes cost approximately £13 per week for unlimited weekly travel.
- International leaders are accommodated in twin rooms shared with other international leaders. If international leaders book a single room, a supplement will be charged at the time of booking and the room will be reserved based on availability.

EC must be advised well in advance (upon booking) of any medical conditions, allergies or medication that needs to be administered to students.





Learning:

Learning Centre

 Chesterton Community College is located near the heart of Cambridge City.

Course

At EC Cambridge students have a choice of attending either a General English course or an Intensive English course.

- General English - 20 lessons (45 mins each) per week. The course will help improve English language skills by focusing on the key areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A strong focus is placed on speech and using the language confidently and fluently.
- Intensive English - 30 lessons (45 mins each) per week. This course follows a similar programme to General English but with 2 extra lessons every lunchtime.
- On the first day, all students sit a placement test - The placement test assesses students in listening, reading, writing and use of English allowing academic staff to place students in the relevant group for their ability.
- Students study in classes of a maximum of 15 students
- Our dedicated and professional teaching staff provide feedback and support and help students build confidence to speak English.
- International classes
- EC Cambridge may utilise a Double Banking timetable. Put simply, students attend morning sessions of classes one week, the next week they attend afternoon sessions, as illustrated below.

Attendance

All students must attend school on a daily basis unless they are genuinely indisposed (due to illness, for example). In the case of a student falling ill we ask homestay provider to take the student to their family doctor. If the student is ill during school hours a member of staff will, if required, accompany them to the hospital (Out-Patients). European students travelling with an European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) are entitled to free public healthcare. All other students are required to pay approximately £60 to see a doctor, which students must pay at the time of their visit.

After School:

Meals

Normally meals are as follows:-

- **Breakfast:** students will receive a breakfast including tea/coffee, toast, jam and cereal at each boarding house in Jesus College residence.
- **Lunch:** is provided in various outlets in Cambridge city centre, these may include restaurants such as Chinese, Italian, Spanish and American, offering a variety of cuisines. Social Leaders will accompany students to pre-arranged restaurants each day. Packed lunches will be provided on full day excursions.
- **Dinner:** is served every evening at our Junior centre. A hot meal will be provided to students and will include a vegetarian option. Salads and dessert (this may include fresh fruit or yoghurt) are provided daily.

If students require a vegetarian diet we must be informed of this prior to their arrival.

Activities

A full and varied activity programme is included in the package. In order to attend all activities, students must purchase a bus pass. Bus passes are purchased on the bus for an approximate cost of £13 per week.

Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

Customer Complaints

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an Initial Course Evaluation form, in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction should they feel unable to speak to us directly. Solutions to any issues will be provided and all necessary parties will be notified when applicable. Students are also requested to complete an End of Course Evaluation form at the end of their stay such that they have the opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

Accommodation Rules

- Students must keep their room neat and tidy, including making their own bed every morning
- Curfew times must be respected by all students
- Students who are not living in the residence are not allowed to stay in any of the rooms
- Girls are not allowed to stay in the boys' rooms and vice versa
- EC must be advised well in advance (upon booking) of any medical conditions, allergies or medication that need to be administered to students
- Students are liable for any damages/breakages caused to school property. Payment for damages must be effected immediately and the residence staff will not allow the students to leave the residence unless payment has been made
- Smoking is NOT accepted at any time (at the residence, at school and neither during activities)

Valid reasons must accompany a request for change of accommodation and each request is considered on its own merits. Such changes are also subject to availability. Students must pay for all costs incurred including transport, additional accommodation charges and cancellation fees (where applicable). The additional charges must be paid in full prior to the move. EC are happy to assist students with arrangements for any justifiable accommodation changes.

Curfew Times

Students should be back at the residence no later than 10.30 pm

Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organised activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate.

Alcohol Consumption

As per U.K. law any EC student on the Junior Programme caught consuming alcohol during their stay risks being expelled from the school and repatriated to their home country. No alcohol is permitted in the school or residence regardless of age.

Drugs

PLEASE NOTE: The consumption of any illegal drugs will result in the immediate expulsion and repatriation of the student and the possible intervention of the police.

Expulsion

EC reserves the right to expel and repatriate a student at his/her own expense for any of the following reasons:

- Possession of any illegal drugs
- Drinking or bringing alcohol on to any EC premises
- Malicious damage to school property or place of accommodation
- If the student is a danger to his/her own safety or that of other students
- Breaking English law
- Repeated failure to attend academic lessons and/or social activities

In any of the above circumstances the student is informed that their stay is going to be terminated with immediate effect. Simultaneously EC informs the student's agent of the student's behaviour and the course of action to be taken. The earliest flight available is booked at the student's expense and an EC staff member accompanies the student to the airport to ensure that the student leaves the country. Following such action EC will terminate all relationships with the student and will be unable to take further responsibility for the student. No refunds will be given to any students who have been expelled.
